Prophecy Fog

Originally developed through **The Theatre Centre's** Tracy Wright Global Archive (with additional support by the **Banff Playwrights Colony** and **Native Earth Performing Arts**), *Prophecy Fog* is a personal story of place and identity. Based on a journey to the Mojave Desert to visit Giant Rock, *Prophecy Fog* uses text, video, and music to weave a conscious remembering of ancient prophecies, rock teachings and star beings. Once home to sacred ceremonies, UFO conventions, an airport, and Howard Hughes' favourite restaurant, Giant Rock now stands covered in graffiti and surrounded by broken bottles. But Giant Rock will connect us to the stars through the stories it has to share, if we are willing to listen.

Featuring award winning actress **Jani Lauzon** and Directed/Dramaturge by The Theatre Centre's Artistic Director **Franco Boni**, Lauzon explores the intersection of theatre and ceremony to create an intimate experience. Joining the team is the accomplished **Melissa Joakim** as lighting designer. Projections include footage of Giant Rock used by permission from **David Cherniack**. Lauzon also draws from her composition skills as sound designer.

Jani Lauzon | Writer/Performer

Jani Lauzon is a multi-disciplinary artist of Metis ancestry. She is a 4 time Dora Mavor Moore nominated actress, a Juno and CAMA nominated singer/songwriter, an award winning screen actor, and the first Metis puppeteer to garner a Gemini Award. Her first short film "eu·tha·na·sia" continues to show at festivals and she is currently in pre-production for her next film, Just One Word. She was Co-Managing Artistic Director of Turtle Gals Performance Ensemble for 10 years helping to develop and tour several original works. Her company Paper Canoe Projects produces her original work including: A Side of Dreams and Prophecy Fog (both currently touring) and I Call myself Princess (slated for a 2018 production). She is also a theatre director and a very proud mother.

Franco Boni | Director/Dramaturge

Since 2003 Franco Boni has served as General and Artistic Director of The Theatre Centre. He has been the Festival director of Rhubarb and Artistic Producer of SummerWorks. Recently he directed *Sea Sick*, a new play by journalist Alanna Mitchell. He is thrilled to be working with Jani and Melissa on *Prophecy Fog*. He is the inaugural recipient of the Ken McDougall Award for emerging directors, and was awarded the Rita Davies Cultural Leadership Award, recognizing his outstanding leadership in the development of arts and culture in the City of Toronto. In 2013, Franco received the George Luscombe Award for Mentorship in Theatre.
